What happens if a student in UIL extracurricular tests positive for COVID-19?

In the event a student in UIL extracurricular (7th-12th grade) tests positive for COVID-19, the parent/guardian should report the positive case to their school nurse. The child is required to stay home from school until all the following conditions are met:



10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared, or 10 days since positive test if no symptoms occur;

AND



24 hours have passed with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medications;

AND



Other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving.

- Loss of taste and smell may persist for weeks or months after recovery and need not delay the end of isolation
- If you had a severe case of COVID-19 and required hospitalization, or you have a severe immune disorder, follow your provider's instructions -- you may need to stay away from others longer.



Per UIL guidance, in addition to the criteria and processes to return to school described above, a student who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 must receive clearance from a physician prior to returning to participation in UIL marching band or athletic activities. The clearance to return to play could potentially take up to two weeks after your child has been cleared to return to school.
